V. Superintendent Reports

The superintendent may present reports at this time.

Dr. Valenzuela thanked the community for the approval of the Maintenance and Operations Override. This is the local levy that supports the fine arts program, graphic arts, performing arts, dance, orchestra, choral, music, band, it also supports athletics, physical education teachers, guidance counselors, safety monitors, and programs that we believe create an excellent learning environment for our students. This is a statement of trust from our community and the work that we do together, that is never taken for granted and appreciated.

NMSI Program Celebration exemplifies one of the secrets of success, I call that the 3 C's. Community, Common Ground and Collaboration. It is a locally funded initiative to a large degree. It involves many of our public and private sector partners, and together we work really hard to deliver outstanding results. Yesterday, Mr. Bonner and myself presented almost \$14,000 in student incentives for achievement on College Board Advanced Placement Programs. In the last 5 years we have doubled in the number of students taking an AP class, the number of AP classes we offer, and the number of students achieving college level scores. It has been a systematic shift in terms of this academic level of rigor,

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expectation and achievement. We are very proud. Our community has come forward to help us bring on the sustainable phase. In the next 3 years we hope as a District to totally take on this program. It is well established and proven program. As we go forward we have received over \$200,000, Mr. Bonner and myself, have gone out to various businesses and we have over \$200,000, to help us phase up our investment and slowly taper-off of the private sector investment. It is a strong example of a change initiative and we are proud.

Dr. Valenzuela shared photos from Copper View of the gardening project. He said thank you to the staff for creating great experiences for our students.

Dr. Valenzuela also mentioned the SIS Veteran's Day Celebration. This is a shining example of support, the spirit of community and the respect that we have for our Veterans. It warmed his heart when he heard from Veterans how much it meant to them to participate in this sincere, meaningful, and symbolic tribute to their service. The testimonies and stories were heartfelt. Dr. Valenzuela said, this is one of those special events that promote our community and our values. Thanks to Ms. Nido and Ms. Nastase and everyone for their commitment.

Dr. Valenzuela read a letter from the Mormon Lake Fire District, in Mormon Lake, Arizona. Dr. Valenzuela summarized the letter from the Assistant Fire Chief. The students from WGHS NJROTC spent their Fall Break helping this community. Msgt. King took students up to Mormon Lake, the students performed various volunteer service projects, clearing brush to prevent forest fires, helping Senior Citizens that need help in their residences in that area. These students exemplified the value of service and character, defining what we believe is important to teach our students. Shawn Western, Asst. Fire Chief, stated in the letter that these students are always welcome there and highly regarded.

Dr. Valenzuela attended some signings of student athletes, who are continuing their academic and athletic careers at the next level. We are proud of these young men and women for the high standards that they have set for themselves, the hard work that they have put in and we are excited about the promising futures that await them after they finish high school and go on to collegiate athletics and academics.

Dr. Valenzuela also attended the Construction Career Days. He is proud to say that in our efforts to integrate the business and the education sectors, the public the private and define common ground solutions and directions to our programs and the sustainment to the of a strong workforce and a strong economic development effort. He had about 170 students participate in the Construction Career Days. Our goal is to raise the bar, to have a strong pipeline to prepare students for the complex and rapidly changing highly skilled and demanding world of the 21st Century. This is what is being accomplished by working together. We also had a great opportunity to take our students to the new Amazon service center in the Vail area. These students had a first hand experience, engineering to the different trades, and a sneak peek of the facility. Dr. Valenzuela wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving. The Board lunch will be tomorrow at 11 a.m., at the ECC.

Dr. Valenzuela also shared a photo of the State Marching Band Festival, WGHS came in 6th place and SHS came in 8th place. Our students continue to shine.

Mr. Tom Murphy was grateful to the voters for passing the M & O Override, they did not all pass across the state. It was our biggest margins of victory. Most of what you saw on the screen is supported by the M & O Override, Band, PAC Dance Team, and extra activities if it was not for our Override.

Mr. Murphy said that it is so great to see Mr. Harris here, a family that has supported the school district way before any of us up here. He said that he remembers when his daughter went on a trip with his granddaughter to Bisbee Mines, 13 years ago. When we were driving down to Bisbee, he was able to tell us about the landscape of the area and what was built. It makes his heart smile when he see all those construction students. Across the board he thanks everyone for their support.

Mrs. Shari Lowell said that she was grateful for the M & O Override passing in our community. We have a student from the Gap program from Germany, they were here for 2 weeks, and in March we will have students go

to Germany. It was amazing to hear about their experiences. She was heavily involved with the swim and band state competitions. Mrs. Lowell was incredibly grateful for the SEEF basketball game she attended, and see both schools come together for SEEF. They raise scholarship grants for our teachers, and have the kids perform and be part of the community. At the AZ MBA State Band Competition, many of you know that at WGHS there was a student pass away 2 weeks before percussion camp, Mason Taylor. The kids have been performing all year to honor Mason, and at the very last performance it didn't matter what they got. The performance was great, his family was in the audience. At this particular performance all the bands come out and stand on the yard line, the percussion team, formed an "M" for Mason, and a snare drum with his picture, she was grateful for that.

Mrs. Dalia Zimmerman said that she also attended Construction Career Days, she said that we were highlighted as one of the District that when we said we were going to bring a certain number of kids, we brought them. If you get a chance to attend this event it is phenomenal, they were pouring cement, going up the poles to do electrical, they were welding it was amazing. Hats off Josh. Most of that is put on by our local Sahuarita people.

Mrs. Kris Ham thanked the community for helping us with the M & O Override. She also wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Mr. John Sparks said that he is grateful for Prop 471 passing, the largest margin that we have seen in years. He is appreciative for all of you voting for that. He also attended the SEEF Basketball Game, and being next to the band he had his ears ringing, it was loud. It was great to see both dance teams perform together. 400 IM Sahuarita boys relay team took 3rd place in State this year, SHS cross country multiple in the top 30, which is a good number in cross country. These students did well with a young program, that is small.
