As you navigate this busy time of year, please make note of the following:



In reading we have learned about finding the central message of a story, and identifying the author's point of view. We will continue learning about fractions, then we will move on to area and perimeter. Finally, we will start timed division drills in January.

We hope you had a relaxing Thanksgiving break and enjoyed the time with your families!

Beginning November 30-December 18, students will take the iReady mid-year benchmark test for reading. Those results will be sent home with 2nd quarter report cards in January. Math testing will take place in January.

In math, we are very proud of the hard work our students have been putting into learning different multiplication strategies! They have all been doing a fantastic job and feeling very accomplished! Way to go, 4th graders! We will finish the quarter by learning multi-digit division strategies and fraction concepts (equivalent fractions, comparing, ordering, adding, and subtracting fractions, and adding and subtracting mixed numbers).

Remember, it is very important that our students are completing work on Google classroom, as well as in the regular classroom. All assigned work counts toward their final grade. We will be busy until the end of the quarter so please make every effort to have your child in class and online!






Greetings from Sixth-Grade Team:

It may be hard to believe, but we are coming to the end of the first semester for the 2020-2021 school year! We are wrapping up and preparing for semester finals. Encourage your student(s) to finish strong with their academic responsibilities by keeping up with assignments and studying for each final. The chart below provides the schedule for finals. If you know that you will be leaving early for Winter Break, please make arrangements to complete before you leave. We'd hate to have you miss a test and get a zero right at the end of the quarter. If students do not take the final they will get a zero on that test.

In addition to finals, the ELA diagnostic iReady assessment will also be administered in December. The Math diagnostic iReady assessment will be administered in January.

The district has sent out a letter encouraging parents/guardians to log into PowerSchool. We are pleased with the additional statement that was included in a district letter to parents: “Although SUSD modified grading at the end of last school year due to the onset of COVID-19, please note that grading policies will be implemented without modifications for Fall 2020. Thank you for your continued support as we strive to do what is best for ALL of our students.”

Sixth grade teachers have modified grading for Fall 2020 because of the pandemic and because of 6th grade being a transition grade, where students must learn to adjust to different teachers and expectations. We have been and will be gradually implementing the district’s grading policies by second semester. We will not be accepting late work for more than one week past the due date, no name papers will not be graded, and time to complete work while absent will be the number of days that students were out.

We hope December brings you and your family great joy. We look forward to the second semester, when students return to us ready to work and eager to learn new concepts in all subjects.

Lastly, please have students bring water bottles. Students are not allowed to use water fountains at this time due to COVID but we do have water bottle filling stations.





Language Arts Highlights

Finishing up the calendar year, we'll switch our focus back to reading literature after focusing on reading informational texts for the greater part of quarter two. Please continue to complete your iReady minutes each week. The lessons in iReady will help fill any gaps in learning caused by the school closures in the spring of the last school year. Reminder: All students have school work to do on asynchronous days. Please continue to check the Google Classroom for work due in each class.

Semester Finals for ELA will take place on 12/10 for Cohort B and 12/14 for Cohort A.





As we enter the final month of 2020, we are wrapping up our study of energy, and then reviewing the concepts that will be on our finals. Students may see things from the areas of Scientific Method, Chemistry, and Energy on our mid-term test.

If a student will not be in class to take their midterm final, they need to make arrangements with their teacher to take it early.





SOCIAL STUDIES

In Social Studies, we just finished a detailed look at state and local governments. We studied topics like the role of a governor in states, the specifics of the town of Sahuarita in terms of demographic information and also discussed the history of voting in this country from Colonial times to when various people obtained the right to vote in the United States during the time of Election Day. We are now moving back to the federal government where we will study the legislative, executive and judicial branches of government in more detail than our initial discussion of their place when studying the actual Constitution, Bill of Rights and other amendments to the Constitution. 



Here's what we have been up to in our Spanish classes this month!


Students in 6th grade have been busy learning about traditions and culture in Argentina and Colombia. We have focused on traditional dishes and drinks, such as "asado" and "dulce de leche" from Argentina and "bandeja paisa" and "arepas" from Colombia. Students have also learned about common traditions for the holidays in both countries and how they relate to their own.

Students in 7th grade continue to learn about the basics of the Spanish language. They have learned numbers 0-60, the basic colors, and greetings in Spanish. We are beginning to work on the construction of a simple sentence in Spanish by identifying the gender of a noun and attaching an appropriate article to the noun.

Spanish I students are doing amazing with their Spanish! I am very proud of their dedication and hard work. We have practiced a lot of vocabulary this month, along with pronouns and a couple of verbs in the present tense. They are starting to construct simple sentences in Spanish, using these verbs. Have paper and pencils available for your child to use for writing. Work together and write a sentence or two about something special. Encourage your child to use the letters and sounds, they are learning in school.


- Write, Write, Write!

The special education team would like to talk to you about one of the most important goals of education, which is to instill the love of learning. The following tips are to help children to fall in love with learning and parents no longer dread homework hassles.

Tip #1: Each evening, set aside a time for family learning. This is a time for your children to do their homework while you model the value of learning by enjoying a book. The best way to create a love of learning in your kids is to show them how much you enjoy it.

Tip #2: Avoid battles by offering choices. Research shows that children are more likely to do their homework if they are given many small choices. For example: "Would you rather do your homework right after school or wait until four o'clock?" or "Are you going to do your homework in your room or at the kitchen table?"


Tip #3: Help only when your child really wants it. There is nothing that creates more homework battles than parents who "help" when help is not wanted. Try asking: "Would you like some ideas on that or would you like me to leave you alone?" Your child's desire to do it alone is a very healthy sign of independence and responsibility.

Tip #4: Spend most of your time noticing what they do well. DO NOT focus on what your child does wrong! Allow your child to get help in those areas from their teachers. Successful parents spend 99 percent of their energy noticing what their kids do well. They say things like: "Show me the very best letter you made today. You really worked hard on that!" or "Look at that math problem. You got it right!"

Tip #5: Help only as long as it's enjoyable for both of you. Too frequently, homework help turns into a homework battle. Smart parents back out of the helper role as soon as they sense conflict brewing. Try hugging your child and saying: "I love you too much to help if it means we are going to argue. I know this is really hard. Good luck."

Tip #6: Help only as long as your child is doing most of the work. Say the following to yourself over and over again: "This is my child's homework. Not mine!"

There is nothing more destructive than stealing the struggle of learning by doing too much for your child. Each time they achieve something difficult on their own, their self-esteem soars and they are better prepared for the real world. We hope that these tips will not only help you and your kids avoid homework battles this school year, but that they will also kindle a lifelong love of learning in your kids!
