
Because we now have an opportunity to end our school year fully in person, I have included some events for you to make a special note of for the month of April:

- Monday, April 5th, 2021. Middle school students will join our K-5 students in attending school in person five days a week. ☺ All current mitigation practices will continue to the greatest extent possible. We cannot eliminate risks, but we can definitely continue to manage them.
- SY 21/22 Registration link is open at SUSD home web page for next year's school registration.
- Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 4/6(Writing), 4/8 (ELA/Math Part 1) and 4/9 (ELA/Math Part2), is AzM2 testing for 3rd-5th grades. April 13th, 15th and 16th is AzM2 Testing for Middle School. Make-Up date for 3rd-5th grade testing is Monday, April 12th. Make-Up date for Middle School is Monday, April 19th. \*Due to a change in the state's testing program, math tests are grade level appropriate with all 7th and 8th grade students expected to participate in grade level testing regardless of alternative or advanced course enrollment.
- AzSCI (Science) testing for 4th and 8th graders only takes place beginning on 4/14-4/30.
- This year's state testing window will provide us an opportunity to formally assess the width and depth of our students' academic progress for this unprecedented school year. It truly is one litmus test that will help us to tailor our academic and reteach/enrichment support for next school with additional clarity. It is never meant to add more stress but simply for meaningful direction.
- 4th Quarter Sports (Virtual Baseball with Coach Mellen).
- Governing Board Meeting at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, April 14th.
- April/May PTO and Site Council Meeting (TBA).
- Virtual K-8 ATS Career Day takes place on Wednesday, April 16th.
- Kindergarten Round-Up/Registration on Monday, April 19th, virtually.

New Coyote Night for Anza's and Copper View's 5th Graders (Future 6th graders) virtual link becomes "live" on Monday, April 26th.





# 5th grade feedback


5th Grade Families,




Ms. Monreal's science classes will begin the rock cycle and plate tectonic units. Students will learn about rocks and minerals and will see different examples.


- ★ Original Birth Certificate (we will make a copy of it for our records)
