
Professional Learning Framework



Math: Problem Solving and Math Discourse Strategies K-5

In the course, teachers will explore problem-solving strategies that support student understanding of addition, subtraction, and multiplication. Teachers will experience problem solving support specifically designed to improve persistence and problem comprehension. Ready Math discourse strategies will be shared and practiced.

Multisyllabic Words and Vocabulary 2-5

This course will focus on preparing teachers to implement advanced decoding techniques. Participants will receive 95% Group's Multisyllabic Skill Routine Cards as well as have a clearer understanding of phonics instruction for intermediate readers. They will also gain new strategies to support students during vocabulary instruction.

Phonological Awareness and Phonics K-2

Facilitators: Margot Herndon, Jan Spooner

Two days: Wed, Nov. 17, 2021, Jan. 19, 2022, 8:00am-1:00pm, SPLI PD Center

Do you have students struggling to read? Phonological awareness is a crucial skill students need to master before they can be successful with phonics and then reading. This course will focus on phonological awareness, phonemic awareness, the alphabetic principle and phonics. Teachers will leave with a deeper understanding of the science of reading and how to support their struggling readers. Materials from 95% Group, Inc. will be provided.

Small Group Reading Instruction for All Students K-5

One day: Mon, February 21, 2022, 8:00am-2:00pm, SPLI PD Center

This course provides instructional strategies for teaching reading interventions and small reading groups for all students including students with Dyslexia. It will include data analysis, creating groups, lesson planning, and instructional strategies. Part of the session will be differentiated specifically for grades K-2 and 3-5 needs.

Socratic Seminar

Socratic seminars enhance reading comprehension, speaking, listening and writing skills: a perfect vehicle for teaching combined literacy skills. Teaching Writing K-2

Teaching Writing 3-5
