

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

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

Teachers provide support in the Google Classroom for each major Edgenuity writing assignment/project. When students check the Classwork section in their Google Classrooms, they will find sample outlines, graphic organizers, and even sample essays/projects so that students can feel more confident about their work. Please note that the materials are presented as assignments to make them more accessible, but are not required for a grade. Please note that for middle school essays Mrs. McCarthy will hold writing classes for each upcoming essay. Students can use their course reports to help them plan for upcoming projects and essays in all their subjects. Happy December! As you finish up the last couple of weeks of first semester, please remember that if you need help with assignments, quizzes, projects, or tests you should do the following: check Google Classroom for additional resources, come get help from your teachers in the Hawks' Nest, or email your teacher. It is very important for you to get through all the material in your classes before finals week. Historically, almost all (98% last semester) of the students who got all the way to the final passed the class with a D (60%) or above. Even better, the majority (72% last semester) earned a B (80%) or above. I'd like to reassure my students that if they complete the class, they are almost guaranteed a passing grade. Additionally, if students reach the final early and are not happy with the grade they've earned so far, they are welcome to ask their teachers to reset assignments or give a retake on a quiz or test they wish to retake. Lastly, to help students prepare for the finals, I am happy to reset any math unit test reviews students wish to redo as review. The questions on the final will be very similar to those on the unit tests, so redoing the reviews will be excellent practice for the final exam. As always, please let me know if you need any help with your math classes.

Thomas Edison provided the first public demonstration of his electric incandescent lamp at his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey.

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



Welcome Winter Ice!

Ice is water in its frozen, solid form. Ice often forms on lakes, rivers and the ocean in cold weather. It can be very thick or very thin. It occurs as frost, snow, sleet and hail.







The expanded molecules make ice a lot lighter than liquid water, which is why ice floats. An iceberg that weighs several tons can still float easily in the ocean, just like a piece of ice floats easily in your cup of water or soda.

A few different types of ice:

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Ice Sheets

Glaciers that cover more than 50,000 square kilometers (19,305 square miles) so land are called ice fields.



Frozen ocean water is called sea ice. Polar bearus (Ursus maritimus) hunt for seals under the cover of the Hudson Bay's old sea ice.



Black Ice

When water hits a cold road and quickly freezes, a thin, clear layer of ice called black ice forms. It's called black icce because unlike snow, which is whtel, black ice is transparent, revealing the black road below.

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ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Sahuarita Digital Pathways Academy is officially its own school this year! As an approved online school, we have mandatory attendance guidelines that we have to follow in order to operate. We are required to report daily attendance minutes for our SDPA students. A strong home-school partnership is needed in order to complete this required task. We need your help each school day to meet this guideline.

All SDPA students will need a Daily Attendance Log completed by a parent or guardian EACH school day.

> Sahuarita Digital Pathways Academy AOI Daily Attendance Log: K -12

Each school day, you will submit the Google Form to report the total number of minutes that your child engaged in their school-related activities including:

- Time spent in live Google Meets (including lessons, Homeroom, Academic Enrichment, and Elective Enrichment).
- Time spent working on asynchronous activities in Google Classroom, Seesaw, i-Ready, Edgenuity, or another online platform.
- Time spent working 1-on-1 with a teacher or learning
- Time spent working on projects, independent reading, writing, or completing offline assignments.
- Time spent working on special activities like Library, Music, PE, Computer Lab, Counseling, etc.

A separate Google Form needs to be completed for each child. Per board policy, students with 10 consecutive absences will be withdrawn. Forms are due each school day by midnight. Thank you so much for your partnership in this process!
