**Math (required core option): Algebra III**

Sahuarita High School currently does not offer a senior year math course for college bound students who have exhibited an average aptitude in mathematics but are not sufficiently prepared for the rigor of Pre-Calculus (a course which is geared toward students who plan to move on to Calculus in college). We also offer Financial Literacy for the standards level students who need a 4th year of mathematics to fulfill the high school graduation requirement in Arizona. (This class results in a deficiency for 4 year colleges and universities in Arizona). Since we no longer offer the PCC Math Class, we currently have a huge gap from Financial Literacy to Pre-calculus. Algebra III is part of the Beyond Textbooks sequence of high school math courses and can be taken by seniors without a deficiency when entering college.

**Physical Education (general elective): Girls Weights**

Freshman girls weightlifting class would be geared for female students that have an aversion to the more “traditional” general PE requirement, or are more comfortable with working out with other females. Hopefully, this will spark an interest for females to continue their physical education and lessen the gender disparity in the elective PE classes available to upperclassmen. Additionally, enrolled female students will gain experience in the ultimate lifetime fitness activity – because weightlifting is low-impact and very accessible, students will be able to apply the skills learned in the classroom to an active lifestyle for many years.

**English:**

**English III/Literature in Americas (Grade 11): Core Credit**

This course will provide students with a hemispheric perspective to the study of American literature by focusing on colonial and post-colonial literature from Canada, the United States, Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean, and South America. This 11th grade course will be an option offered in place of regular English III. The readings will include non-fiction, novels, narratives, short stories, poems, and plays drawn from the rich writing produced by authors such as Gabriel Garcia Marquez, John Steinbeck, Willa Cather, Pablo Neruda, Isabel Allende, and Robert Frost. The course will focus on close reading, literary and rhetorical analysis, and composition.

**English III/Fine Arts Literature (Grade 11): Core Credit**

This course will focus on the fine arts such as theatre, music, art and history pertaining to famous theatrical plays and American literature. This 11th grade course will be an option, offered in place of regular English III. Students will focus on understanding character development, setting design, artistic symbolism, author analysis, theatrical writing, public speaking based performances, music correspondence and costume design. Students will experience short and long plays from different time periods as well as popular American literature pertaining to the Harlem Renaissance, the Jazz Age, the 1950's and Romanticism that focuses on the fine arts.

**English IV/Composition and Current Affairs (Grade 12): Core Credit** This course will develop senior level composition and analysis skills using a broad spectrum of writings about select current events and issues. This 12th grade course will be an option, offered in place of regular English IV, and would coincide with students' registration in either American Government or AP US Government and Politics. Students would read informational text almost exclusively as they studied various current issues, their contexts and background, and wrote and spoke about them, analyzing and applying their growing knowledge of persuasion in the process.

**War at 360 Degrees (Grades 10-12): Elective Credit**

This course will explore wars throughout American history from a variety of perspectives. Students will study the literature and non-fiction writings that have accompanied America's military conflicts, using these written accounts to study the social, cultural, political, and personal dimensions of war. This course will be aligned, chronologically, with American History in order that students will benefit from studying similar topics, but from very different perspectives. Students will also have the opportunity to conduct original research and interviews with veterans in our community.

**Career and Technical Education**

**Broadcasting (Grades 10-12): Elective Credit**

This course will focus on producing, editing, and distributing media for live broadcasting. Students will be responsible for writing, filming, and distributing all Walden Grove news and live streaming events. This is an elective credit.

**Fine Arts:**

**Musical Theater (Grades 9-12): Elective Credit**

This course will focus on the history and performance of American Musical Theatre. Students will study the work of the actor/singer/dancer and use their gained knowledge to develop as performers across the stage, from audition through performance. Students will prepare and present as soloists as well as members of small groups and larger ensembles. As a workshop course, students will prepare material for class presentation and critique and gain both community and college audition preparedness. Finally, the class will participate in a culminating showcase performance at the end of the year.

**Science:**

**AP Physics 1 (Grades 11-12): Core Credit**

This class is an algebra-based, introductory college-level physics course that explores topics such as Newtonian mechanics (including rotational motion): work, energy, and power; mechanical waves and sound; and introductory, simple circuits. Through inquiry-based learning, students will develop scientific critical thinking and reasoning skills.

**Intro to Kinesiology (Grades 11-12): Core Credit**

This class will introduce students to biomechanics concepts, motor behavior concepts, exercise physiology concepts, and sport psychology concepts. Students will also be introduced to potential job opportunities for Kinesiology Scientists.

**Social Studies:**

**AP Human Geography (Grades 10-12): Elective Credit**

This course is equivalent to an introductory college-level course in human geography. The course introduces students to the systematic study of patterns and processes that have shaped human understanding, use, and alteration of Earth's surface. Students employ spatial concepts and landscape analysis to examine socioeconomic organization and its environmental consequences. They also learn about the methods and tools geographers use in their research and applications. The curriculum reflects the goals of the National Geography Standards.

**America at War (Grades 11-12): Elective Credit**

This course will explore two of the most moving chapters in American history; the Civil War and World War II. It will examine the causes of both conflicts and the themes that underlie them. Using a variety of sources, the political, social, and economic implications of both wars will be examined and debated. Most importantly, it will analyze the nature of warfare, tactics, and the role of technology in both the triumphs and tragedies of all sides in each conflict. The course will be guided by lecture, award-winning documentaries and films, debates, and war games.
