V. Call to the Public

Consideration and discussion of comments and concerns from the public. Those wishing to address the governing board on items not on tonight's agenda may do so at this time or at the Board's discretion at the time the item appears on the agenda. Speakers are requested to hold their comments to two (2) minutes or less. In accordance with the Arizona Open Meeting Law, board members may not respond, comment, or ask questions of speakers regarding issues not on the agenda.

Brooke Weber/Walden Grove Students – Attending the meeting on behalf of her fellow students. She asked for approval of the IGA between Pima County and Sahuarita Unified School District. She shared how the lack of fields at Walden Grove High School has impacted student safety and instructional time:

Marcos Blanco – IGA Pima County – Physical Education Teacher and Cross-Country and Track and Field Coach at Walden Grove High School. Current IGA between the district and Pima County does not allow Walden Grove High School to have adequate fields for P.E., Band and Athletics. In the 56 minute class and when his classes have to walk to designated fields it cuts his instruction time to 33 minutes which doesn't allow much time to teach a lesson. This is Walden Grove's first year for Track and Field. Currently, there is no place to hold practice and sharing the fields with the public adds constraints.

Chris Laughlin – Baseball Coach at Walden Grove – Baseball Program – Team had to overcome adversity last year because of the lack of fields. Fan base was nothing, traveled to all

games. This is not practical for a high school student athlete to succeed. Instruction time was impacted which directly affected student athletes academic achievement. Baseball Program deserves to have a fan base, athletes should have the same opportunity to achieve academically as a normal student athlete. Approve the IGA between Pima County and Sahuarita Unified School District.

Ed Payan owner of USA Youth Sports, member of the board of Copper Hills Little League and President of a Soccer Club. Serious need of fields. He relies on the Town of Sahuarita Parks and Receptions for use of fields. Rates that the school district is offering are not reasonable. They would not be able to have a Basketball Program if they increase their rates. Soccer has the most participation. Fields are not safe at Anza Trail because there are rocks on the field. If they could have some time on some of the school fields it would relieve some of the pressure. He asked that fields are fixed so they can be used.
