

MINUTES April 28, 2004

Regular Governing Board Meeting & Executive Session April 28, 2004 - 6:30 p.m. – Sub Hall B – Sahuarita Auditorium 350 W. Sahuarita Rd., Sahuarita, Arizona

I. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

In the absence of President Anthony Bruno, Clerk Elaine Hall called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Also present were Board members Michael Lurkins, Daniel Zobenica, Martin McGee, Superintendent Dr. Jay C. St. John and Business Manager Charlotte Gates. There were 38 guests. The Pledge of Allegiance was observed.

II. Approval of Agenda

Dr. St. John recommended approval of the agenda as it was distributed. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Zobenica. The motion carried.

III. Approval of Minutes – April 14, 2004

Dr. St. John recommended approval of the minutes for the regular meeting on April 14, 2004 as distributed. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Lurkins. The motion carried.

VII. New Business

A. Instruction

1. Jerry Price – England Exchange Program – Information Only

Dr. St. John asked Jerry Price to attend the meeting to briefly explain the England Exchange Program. Mr. Price stated that this year's trip was the fifth one made; the first trip made was in March of 2000. Fifty-three Sahuarita High School students have visited Archbishop Iisley's School in Birmingham, England. The trip is approximately two weeks, which included one week in Birmingham and another in London. Each student stays with a host family while in Birmingham. The students attend classes to have a general overview as to what school is like in England. Late in the morning they take off for day trips. This year included City Centre of Birmingham, Stratford, Warwick Castle, and Ironbridge. The students obtain a good lesson in cultural differences during the trip.

2. Approval of Request from SHS Student for Early Release Schedule – Discussion and Possible Action

Dr. St. John provided the Board with information from a sophomore at Sahuarita High School. The student requested an early release schedule for his course of study during the upcoming two school years. The student will be classified as a senior next year due to the number of credits he has earned. He would like to attend school half day so that he may work the other half of the day to save money for his post-secondary education. Dr. St. John recommended waiver of the policy and approval of the student's request. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Zobenica. The motion carried.

B. Personnel – Discussion and Possible Action

1. Approval of Additional Football Coaches for 2004-05 School Year

Dr. St. John provided the Board with a request from Larry Cleveland for two additional paid coaching positions for the 2004-05 football season. In Dr. St. John's conversation with Mr. Cleveland he indicated that the current high school football coaching staff reports 130 students signed up to participate in football at all levels. Dr. St. John recommended adding the two additional football coaches. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Zobenica. The motion carried.

2. Approval of Additional Positions for 2004-05 School Year

Mrs. Gates indicated to Dr. St. John that she feels comfortable with adding 10 additional teaching positions for the 2004-05 school year. Dr. St. John has given principals instructions to begin looking for those positions. He suspects that there will be additional requests for teaching positions from the high school and possibly the English Language Learner Program. One half of one of the additional positions for 2004-2005 will be a combination Supervision of Instruction/Grant Writer position. This will be a half time position and will be advertised immediately internally. That position will assist Dr. St. John in supervising the Curriculum Instruction Management Team and the New Teacher Induction Program. With any extra time, that person will be given grant-writing opportunities for the district. Mary Northey is preparing a job description at this time. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Zobenica. The motion carried.

1. Annual Comprehensive Audit Financial Report FY 2003

Information on the district's annual comprehensive audit for FY 2003 was distributed as an information item.

C. Governing Board – Discussion and Possible Action

1. Revision of Policy JLCB - Immunizations of Students

A policy revision recommendation regarding the immunizations of students from the Arizona School Boards Association was distributed to the Board. Dr. St. John recommended approval of the revision. Mr. Zobenica made the motion and was seconded by Mr. Lurkins. The motion carried.

VIII. Superintendent/Administrative Reports

Dr. St. John – The land transfer between the school district and the Town of Sahuarita is complete. In an escrow account is \$551,100.00 to pay for the new administration building. The Town of Sahuarita now owns the property next Anamax Park.

Current enrollment is 2625

Dr. St. John received a meal service report from the Arizona Department of Education Child Nutrition Program. Sahuarita Unified School District passed both performance standards with flying colors. The district is being nominated for an Outstanding Administrative Review Award.

Steve Kellermeyer, Scott Downs, Kathy Shiba, Carol Salica, Wayne Ross, Becky Gaunt, Barb Smith, Mary Northey, Scott Boone and Dr. St. John have been recruiting at NAU in Flagstaff, ASU West Campus, University of Arizona and the University of New Mexico the past few weeks.

Dr. St. John attend the High School Drama play "Our Miss Brooks", it was very well done.

The Grad Night car is in the district's possession. It is approximately a \$5000.00 automobile and was donated by the Santa Cruz Valley Car Nuts.

Commander Battle sent a letter with an update on attaining the Distinguish Unit Award. Next year will be their first year of eligibility. The most important event is the annual inspection. Another critical area is attainment of stated goals. Efforts have already begun to ensure these are attained.

Dr. St. John received a letter from the Arizona School Boards Association congratulating the district on its efforts to maintain a safe work environment.

The Metropolitan Education Commission's Crystal Apple Awards Luncheon is on Wednesday, May 5 at 11:00 at TCC. The Board is invited to attend. Sahuarita Intermediate School nominated the Hispanic Employees Association from Raytheon to receive an award and they are going to be given one.

The principals met with representatives from the University of Arizona South Campus. They are a very aggressive part of the University of Arizona that produces approximately 60 to 80 elementary teachers and 15 to 20 high school teachers from their campus. They have started a program in the Vail District and at the Pima East Campus that takes those people who have part of their education completed, but not all of it, offers them a two-year program after an Associates Degree or a certain number of credits and admits them into the University of Arizona South's Teacher Education Program. The district will be meeting with the support staff that have

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college hours and would like to work out plans to get help financially and become teachers. Another item that was address was student teaching in the district.

Mr. Larry McKee met this afternoon with the high school faculty and will be here all day tomorrow to meet with staff and students.

Rancho Sahuarita is interested in asking the Board if the district would like to have entrance monuments placed along the primary school where Rancho Sahuarita Blvd will be. They will be putting a wall along the primary school and there will be a stop light entrance between the old elementary parking lot and Daryl's building for the buses and maintenance vehicles.

Mr. Lewis' class started a project they call "Personal Ponies". The ponies were all molded from the same mold, but are all very unique. Each child wrote a few sentences describing their pony and what was special for them. The ponies were taken to the Pima County Fair and received great complements. Each student was awarded a blue ribbon and the display received best in class. The ponies were on display at the meeting.

The Jump for Heart poster contest was held recently and two posters from SUSD were chosen to enter into further competition. This is the second year students from the district have won 1st and 2nd place in the contest. Last years winners were Katie Rieman and Mandy Lurkins. This years winners were Victoria Rogers and Tanya Ott.
